

VYD Safeguarding Policy for children and vulnerable adults

2020

1.VYD acknowledges its responsibility to safeguard the welfare of every child, young person and vulnerable adult directly connected with the organisation and is committed to providing a safe environment for all. We recognise that those aged 16/17 years-of-age are legally defined as children and therefore we have a responsibility to ensure appropriate safeguards are in place.

As such we subscribe to The Football Association's (The FA) Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy and Procedures.

VYD endorses and adopts the following key safeguarding principles:

- The child or vulnerable adult's welfare is, and must always be, the paramount consideration;
- All children, young people and vulnerable adults have a right to be protected from abuse regardless of their; age, gender, gender reassignment, sexual orientation, marital status or civil partnership, race, nationality, ethnic origin, colour, religion or belief, ability or disability, pregnancy and maternity;
- All suspicions and allegations of abuse will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately; and
- Working in partnership with other organisations, children, young people, vulnerable adults and their parents/carers is essential. We acknowledge that every child, young person or vulnerable adult who plays or participates in football should be able to take part in an enjoyable and safe environment and be protected from poor practice and abuse.

VYD recognises that this is the responsibility of every adult involved in our organisation.

2. VYD has a role to play in safeguarding the welfare of all children, young people and vulnerable adults by protecting them from physical, sexual or emotional harm and from neglect or bullying. It is noted and accepted that The FA's Safeguarding Children Regulations (see The FA Handbook TheFA.com/football-rules-governance/lawsandrules/fa-handbook) apply to everyone in football whether in a paid or voluntary capacity, including coaches/managers, volunteers, match officials, helpers, or medical staff or other club officials/helpers.

3. We endorse and adopt The FA's Safer Recruitment guidelines and we will:

- Specify what the role is and what tasks it involves;
- Request identification documents;
- As a minimum meet and chat with the applicant(s) and where possible interview people before appointing them;
- Ask for and follow up with 2 references before appointing someone; and
- Where eligible require an FA-accepted DBS enhanced with barred list Check, in line with The FA's current Safeguarding Children Policy and Regulations.

All current VYD members working in eligible roles with children, young people and vulnerable adults, such as coaches/managers and physiotherapists, are required to hold an in-date FA accepted DBS enhanced with barred list check as part of safer recruitment practice.

It is noted and accepted that The FA will consider the relevance and significance of the information obtained via the DBS Process and that all suitability decisions will be made in accordance with legislation and in the best interests of children and young people.

If there are concerns regarding the appropriateness of a club official who is already involved or who has approached us to become part of VYD, guidance will be sought from the County FA.

It is accepted that The FA aims to prevent people with a history of relevant and significant offending from having contact with children, young people or vulnerable adults and the opportunity to influence policies or practice with children, young people or vulnerable adults. This is to prevent direct sexual or physical harm and to minimise the risk of 'grooming' within football.

4. VYD supports The FA's Whistle Blowing policy which requires any adult or young person with concerns about an adult in a position of trust within football can 'whistle blow' by contacting The FA Safeguarding Team on 0800 169 1863, by writing to The FA Case Manager at The Football Association, Wembley Stadium, PO Box 1966, London SW1P 9EQ, by emailing Safeguarding@TheFA.com or alternatively by going direct to the Police, Children's Social Care or the NSPCC.

VYD encourages everyone to know about The FA's Whistle Blowing Policy and to utilise it if necessary.

5. We acknowledge and endorse The FA's identification of bullying as a category of abuse. Bullying of any kind is not acceptable at our organisation. If bullying does occur, all players or parents/carers can access our anti-bullying policy and know that incidents will be dealt with appropriately.

Incidents need to be reported in accordance with paragraph 6 below.

In cases of serious bullying the CFA Designated Safeguarding Officer may be contacted.

6. At VYD, safeguarding is everyone's responsibility, and we know that inaction is not an option and if anyone is worried about a child or vulnerable adult it is important that they report their concerns to Gary Pleece or other member of VYD's staff, who will deal with reported concerns as follows:

i. Gary Pleece or a member of the VYD's staff will manage poor practice and where necessary seek advice from the CFA Designated Safeguarding Officer (CFA DSO).

ii. Gary Pleece or a member of VYD's committee or staff will make referrals about more serious concerns to the CFA DSO, or in an emergency contact the Police or Children's Social Care.

iii. We will ensure that if the child needs immediate medical treatment that we take them to a hospital or call an ambulance and tell them it is a child protection concern.

Gary Pleece or a member of VYD's staff will keep records of the actions taken and keep the CFA Designated Safeguarding Officer informed.

v. If Gary Pleece or a member of VYD's staff is not available at any time, or the matter is clearly serious, all our members should be aware that they can:

- Contact the CFA DSO directly;
- Contact The FA's Safeguarding Team on 0800 169 1863 or Safeguarding@TheFA.com;

- Contact the Police or Children's Social Care;

- Call the NSPCC 24-hour Helpline for advice on 0808 800 5000 or text 88858 or email help@nspcc.org.uk

VYD understands and accepts our collective responsibility to adhere to our safeguarding children and vulnerable adults policy and procedures. We commit to ensuring our members are aware of and have access to our policies.
